

The East Renfrewshire Council
(B764 Moor Rd & Over Enoch Rd, Eaglesham)
(Temporary 24 Hour Rural Clearway)
Order 2021



The East Renfrewshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as “The East Renfrewshire Council (B764 Moor Rd & Over Enoch Rd, Eaglesham) (Temporary 24 Hour Rural Clearway) Order 2021” and comes into effect on 15 February 2021 and will remain in effect for a maximum period of 18 months.

2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power;

"lay-by" in relation to a main carriageway, means any area at the side of the road intended for use by waiting vehicles;

"main carriageway" means any carriageway of a road used primarily by through traffic, but excludes grass verges and any other lay-by not described above;

"verge" means any part of a road which is not a carriageway or lay-by ;

3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the main carriageways specified in the Schedule to this Order.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of the roads referred to in that Article :-

(i) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the length of the road so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of the road, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

(ii) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose

in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes ;

- (ii) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident ;

Lengths of Road within the boundary of East Renfrewshire Council	Length of Road Affected	Side
B764 Moor Road	From a point 160m or thereby southwest of the extended south western kerblineline of Alnwick Drive to the Council boundary with East Ayrshire Council, a distance of approximately 5,600 metres (3.5 miles) or thereby.	Both
Over Enoch Road, Eaglesham	From its junction with South Road to the end of the public road at the access to Carrot Farm, a distance of approximately 2,972 metres (1.9 miles) or thereby.	Both
