

The Glasgow City Council (Laurieston) (Traffic Regulation) Order 2014

Glasgow City Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

Citation and Commencement

1. a) This Order may be cited as "The Glasgow City Council (Laurieston) (Traffic Regulation) Order 2014" and shall come into operation on Thursday the Third Day of April 2014.
- b) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
- c) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

Definitions

2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"Chief Constable" means Chief Constable of Police Scotland;

"Council" means Glasgow City Council;

"Disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Scotland) Regulations 2002;

"Disabled vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a Disabled person's badge in the "relevant position";

"Emergency services vehicle" means a vehicle being used by Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance Services or Civil Defence Organisation;

"Emergency services purposes" means the saving of life or extinguishing fire or meeting any other like emergency;

"Marked police vehicle" means a police vehicle marked with Police livery;

"Parking attendant" means any person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to issue penalty charge notices;

"Pedal cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle of such class as is to be treated as not being a motor vehicle for the purposes of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a device containing the information required by the Road Traffic Act 1991, as amended, for a penalty charge notice;

"Public holiday" means Christmas Day, and New Year's Day;

"Relevant position" has the same meaning as in Regulation 12 of the Disabled Person (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2002;

"Universal postal service" has the same meaning as in the Section 4 Postal Services Act 2000;

"Vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether by animal or mechanical power;

Schedule 1
No waiting at any time

Unnamed Road north of Cumberland Street

1. On both sides, from the extended north kerblines of Cumberland Street to its north kerblines, a distance of 113 metres or thereby. Excluding parking bays.

Unnamed Road within development west of Gorbals Street

1. On both sides, from the extended east kerblines of the unnamed road north of Cumberland Street to its east kerblines, a distance of 200 metres or thereby. Excluding parking bays.

Unnamed Road within development broadly opposite Surrey Street

1. On both sides, from the extended south kerblines of the unnamed road west of Gorbals Street to its south kerblines, a distance of 53 metres or thereby. Excluding parking bays.
