**PERTH AND KINROSS COUNCIL (ABERFELDY TRAFFIC
MANAGEMENT) (VARIATION) (NO 3) ORDER 2011**

(NO/10/11)

Perth and Kinross Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32, 35, 44, 45, 46, 49, and 53, and Part IV of Schedule 9 and Schedule 10 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the "Perth and Kinross Council (Aberfeldy Traffic Management) (Variation) (No. 3) Order 2011" and shall come into operation on the Fifteenth day of October Two thousand and eleven.
2. The Perth and Kinross Council (Aberfeldy Traffic Management) Order 1998 is hereby varied and shall henceforth have effect subject to the amendments thereto specified and described in the Schedule to this Order.

**PERTH AND KINROSS COUNCIL (ABERFELDY TRAFFIC
MANAGEMENT) (VARIATION) (NO 3) ORDER 2011
SCHEDULE**

The Perth and Kinross Council (Aberfeldy Traffic Management) Order 1998 requires to be varied as follows:-

1. In **PART I GENERAL PROVISIONS, Interpretation,**

- (a) Delete the sections “**disabled person**”, “**disabled person’s badge**” and “**disabled person’s vehicle**” in their entirety and substitute with the following:-

“**disabled person**” means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000;

“**disabled persons’ badge**” has the meaning assigned to it by Regulation 11 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000;

“**disabled persons’ vehicle**” means a motor vehicle which is displaying a disabled persons badge being used in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Scotland) Regulations 2000.

“**disabled persons’ parking place**” means an area of a road designated solely for the parking of disabled persons’ vehicles.

- (b) Delete the sections “**invalid carriage**” and “**public service bus**” in their entirety.

2. In **Part III PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS**

- (a) After **Waiting**, 19. add and insert the following:-

Disabled Persons’ Parking Places

19A No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle other than a disabled persons vehicle to wait at any time in any length of road specified in **PART IIC** of the Schedule.

3. In **PART IV EXEMPTIONS**

- (a) At the section **Public Service Bus**, 26. delete the paragraph in its entirety and insert the words “Not Used”.

4. After **PART IIB** of the Schedule to The Perth and Kinross Council (Aberfeldy Traffic Management) Order 1998, add and insert the following:-

PART IIC

DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACE

1. **OLD CRIEFF ROAD**

That part of the north side of Old Crieff Road which is bounded on the north side by the edge of carriageway, which has a width throughout of 3 metres, and which extends 17 metres east of its junction with The Square, Aberfeldy being 5 metres or thereby in length.

2. **BURNSIDE LANE**

That part of the south side of Burnside Lane which is bounded on the south side by the edge of carriageway, which has a width throughout of 3 metres, and which extends 15 metres west of its junction with The Square, Aberfeldy being 5 metres or thereby in length.

Council Reasons

The Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009 requires Perth and Kinross Council to promote or vary their existing Road Traffic Orders for waiting restrictions to allow the enforcement of all Disabled Persons Parking Places.
