## **SOUTH AYRSHIRE COUNCIL**

**(Waiting Restrictions)**

**ORDER 2013**

The South Ayrshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4, 32, 45 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the 1984 Act") as amended and the Road Traffic Act 1991 ("the 1991 Act") as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable of Police Scotland in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the "South Ayrshire Council (Prestwick Airport Perimeter) (Various Roads) (Waiting Restrictions) Order 2013", and shall come into operation on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2013.
2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:

"vehicle", unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power;

"Council" means South Ayrshire Council;

"Road" has the same meaning as in the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 (c.54);

"the 1984 Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;

“the 1991 Act” means the Road Traffic Act 1991;

3. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament.
5. Save as provided in Article 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule 1 annexed and executed as relative to this Order.
6. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall:
  - a) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those Articles -
    - (i) for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage;
    - (ii) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the said lengths of the roads referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.
    - (iii) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes;
    - (iv) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond

his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;

- (v) if the vehicle is in the service of, or employed by, a Postal Delivery Service and is waiting in any of the lengths of the roads while the postal packets addressed to premises adjacent thereto are being unloaded from the vehicle or having being unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent thereto;
- (vi) for the purposes of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is standing at the kerb and is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (vii) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with funeral operations or weddings.

7. Save as provided in Article 8 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8.00am and 8.00pm in any of the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule 2 annexed and executed as relative to this Order.

8. Nothing in Article 7 of this Order shall:

- a) prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road referred to in those Articles -
  - (i) for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage;
  - (ii) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the said lengths of the roads referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984.

- (iii) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire brigade and ambulance purposes;
- (v) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (v) if the vehicle is in the service of, or employed by, a Postal Delivery Service and is waiting in any of the lengths of the roads while the postal packets addressed to premises adjacent thereto are being unloaded from the vehicle or having being unloaded therefrom are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent thereto;
- (vi) for the purposes of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is standing at the kerb and is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (vii) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with funeral operations or weddings.

9. The Order specified in Schedule 3 annexed and executed as relative to this Order is hereby revoked.
